News from the Embassy

New Ambassador of Switzerland to Pakistan

H.E. Mr. Georg Steiner has been appointed the new Ambassador of Switzerland to Pakistan and Afghanistan. Ambassador Steiner was the Ambassador of Switzerland to Nigeria with concurrent accreditations to Niger, Chad and ECOWAS prior to his current assignment. He has also been the Ambassador of Switzerland to Libya and held positions abroad in Washington D.C. (World Bank; Swiss Executive Director's office), Vienna (Delegation of Switzerland to the OSCE) and Tehran (Deputy Chief of mission at the Embassy of Switzerland) as well as in Bern including the Head of the Crisis Management Centre of the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs.

Ambassador Steiner was born and grew up in Lucerne, possesses a university degree in the discipline of law from the University of Fribourg and is admitted to the bar in Switzerland.

SWISS GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE FOR FLOODS IN PAKISTAN

In relation to the floods, Switzerland has responded with a CHF 3 million contribution in support of emergency relief measures. The Swiss government has also sent a Rapid Response Team to support the humanitarian response on the ground. This team is assisting Pakistani populations in the flood-affected areas of the province of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa through the facilitation of the Embassy.

Ambassador Georg Steiner called on the Foreign Minister of Pakistan, H.E. Mr. Bilawal Bhutto Zardari. During the meeting at the Foreign Ministry, both sides reaffirmed their commitment to further strengthening the ties between the two countries. They also exchanged views on several issues of mutual interest.

Mr. Alberto Groff had a meeting with H.E. Mr. Ahsan Iqbal on 1st September 2022 where bilateral issues of mutual interest including the CPEC and Free Tarde Agreement between the two countries were discussed.

The then Ambassador of Switzerland to to Pakistan, Ambassador Bénédict de Cerjat met with key officials of the government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa including the Governor, the Speaker of the Provincial Assembly and the Finance/Health Minister in January 2022 in Peshawar to discuss the entire gamut of bilateral relations between Switzerland and Pakistan.



11th Round of Bilateral Political Consultations

Ambassador Raphael Nägeli, the Assistant State Secretary for Asia-Pacific of the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs of Switzerland, met with the Additional Secretary Europe, Dr. Muhammad Tariq at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Pakistan on 12 November 2021 to hold the 11th round of bilateral Political Consultations between Switzerland and Pakistan.

In addition to bilateral political relations, the talks focused on economy, trade, cooperation in science, education, technology, security, migration as well as regional dynamics and multilateral issues. The Swiss delegation also paid courtesy calls to the Foreign Secretary, Mr. Sohail Mehmood, the Additional Secretary Asia Pacific, Mr. Asim Iftikhar Ahmad, and the Special Assistant to the Prime Minister on CPEC affairs, Mr. Khalid Mansoor, to discuss issues of mutual interest.

To conclude the bilateral Political Consultations, both sides expressed their willingness to remain constructively and meaningfully engaged for strengthening relations between Pakistan and Switzerland.



Visit of Senior Swiss migration official to Pakistan to assess Afghan Refugee Situation

A Swiss delegation led by Ambassador Vincenzo Mascioli, Director of International Cooperation at the Swiss State Secretariat for Migration, visited Islamabad from 21-22 October 2021 to hold meetings with high-level Pakistani government officials and international partners. The objective of the visit was to assess the situation of Afghan refugees in Pakistan.

ECONOMIC DIPLOMACY

Meeting with the Minister of Commerce of Pakistan

The then Ambassador of Switzerland to Pakistan, Mr. Bénédict de Cerjat met with the Federal Minister for Commerce & Investment of Pakistan, H.E. Mr. Syed Naveed Qamar. Issues of bilateral and mutual economic interest of Switzerland and Pakistan were discussed during the meeting. While mentioning notable investments of Swiss companies in Pakistan, the Ambassador also communicated their few concerns while doing business in the country.



Agreement between Switzerland and Pakistan concerning the Debt Service Suspension Initiative (DSSI)

The World Bank and the IMF had urged the G20 countries to suspend temporarily debt-service payments of 73 developing countries affected by COVID. While recognizing this DSSI, Switzerland as a bilateral creditor to Pakistan had also extended debt relief to Pakistan by signing three agreements concerning the extension of the DSSI.

Presentation by Dr. Reza Baqir, the then Governor of the State Bank of Pakistan, at the Swiss Embassy in Islamabad

The then Ambassador of Switzerland, Mr. Bénédict de Cerjat, hosted an address by the then Governor of the State Bank of Pakistan, Dr. Reza Baqir, on "the Economy of Pakistan" at his residence in February 2022. Governor Baqir stated that despite the challenging global environment during the COVID-19 pandemic, Pakistan comparatively fared better than most other countries. In terms of the outlook, Governor Baqir outlined inflation and the current account deficit as challenges to the economy and linked them to the global surge in commodities prices, especially energy prices.

The event was well-attended by members of the Swiss Business Council, Ambassadors of multiple countries, and Parliamentarians. The audience took advantage of this opportunity and actively took part in discussions during the event.

Doing Business in Pakistan – Perceptions and Realities

Tuesday, 7 December 2021, 10:30hrs to 12:30hrs (Swiss Time) 14:30hrs to 16:30hrs (Pakistan Time)



Taking advantage of the virtual sphere, the Embassy of Switzerland in Pakistan, in collaboration with the Swiss-Asian Chamber of Commerce (SACC) in Zürich, organized a webinar entitled "Doing Business in Pakistan – Perceptions and Realities" on 7 December 2021.

Well-attended by around 50 participants, the webinar focused on Pakistan as a country of opportunities for Swiss companies and SMEs. After the welcome address by Ambassador Bénédict de Cerjat, the keynote speakers including Mr. Christoph Sprung of SACC, Mr. Peter Spirgi from Rieter Machine Works, Mr. Christian Herter, MD, xtendum, Mr. Ahmed Naveed Chaudhary, former CEO, Sika Pakistan, and Mrs. Heike Van de Kerkhof, CEO, Archroma International AG shared their experiences and perspectives.

Concluding the webinar, the Embassy proposed to organize the visit of a Swiss Business delegation soon to tap the potential of the Pakistani market.

CULTURAL DIPLOMACY

Swiss National Day

National Day of Switzerland was celebrated at the Serena Hotel on 1st of August 2022. The Federal Minister for Power, H.E. Mr. Khurram Dastgir Khan, was the Guest of Honor on this occasion. While congratulating Switzerland on the National Day, the Federal Minister appreciated Switzerland's role in promoting peace, interfaith harmony and support to Afghan refugees in Pakistan. He also called Switzerland a critical partner and stressed that a free trade agreement (currently under review) between the two countries could prove to be the gateway to Europe. Furthermore, the Chargé d'Affaires a.i. of Switzerland, Mr. Alberto Groff, highlighted that Switzerland has become a non-permanent member of the United Nations Security Council this year and looks forward to actively contributing to peace and stability. In this context, he also mentioned the Ukraine Recovery Conference held in Lugano, Switzerland in July and Switzerland's role in providing good services and mediation activities for countries in conflict.

Francophonie Festival

To celebrate the Francophonie Festival in Pakistan, the Embassy of Switzerland in Islamabad and the Foundation for Arts Culture and Education (FACE) jointly hosted two screenings of Swiss films, namely Schellen-Ursli (A Bell for Ursli) and La Femme et Le TGV (The Railroad Lady) on 17th March 2022. Schellen-Ursli is the most famous Swiss children's book after Heidi. The story has touched generations and has been world-famous for more than seven decades. La Femme et Le TGV received nominations for many industry awards, including the Academy Award for Best Live Action Short Film. Inspired by factual events, the movie explores loneliness and human connections.

The students and teachers of various schools, journalists and diplomats attended the event.

Each year in March, the Embassy of Switzerland and the Francophone community in Islamabad celebrate the richness of the French language and cultural diversity of the Francophone countries. The Francophonie Festival brings together people who not only speak French but also feel, in one way or another, connected to the Francophone community.





To celebrate La Fête de la Francophonie, the Embassy of Switzerland in Islamabad displayed its Stall along with other Francophone Missions in Pakistan at Alliance Française Islamabad on 19 March 2022. The Swiss Stall showcased cultural facets, food, products and informative brochures about the country. The Ambassador of Switzerland, Mr. Bénédict de Cerjat, appreciated the organizers for showcasing the diversity of the Francophone countries. The guests showed keen interest in the event and enjoyed the musical concert and sampling of the regional food at the stalls.

The Chargé d'Affaires, a.i. of Switzerland, Mr. Alberto Groff, hosted a reception for the Swiss Government Excellence Scholarship Recipients at his residence on the 2nd of September 2022.

The students shared their academic achievements and thanked the Government of Switzerland for supporting them through endowed scholarships enabling them to share their gained expertise and knowledge through working in various capacities in the country.



Relaunch of EHL – Serena Hotels Hospitality Education Program

In an exclusive gathering, Ambassador Mr Bénédict de Cerjat, co-hosted a reception with Serena Hotel, Islamabad to celebrate the relaunch of the Serena Hotels Executive Education Programme in collaboration with École hôtelière de Lausanne (EHL) at the Embassy of Switzerland on 15 February 2022. Founded in 1893 in Lausanne, EHL is seen as the world's first hospitality management school.

Mr. de Cerjat lauded Serena Hotels for capacity building through world-class training in the hospitality industry in partnership with EHL and stressed that this initiative is in line with the government's vision to improve tourism and service sectors. The event was well-attended by government officials, the business community and professionals in the tourism and service sectors.


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




Visit of the Deputy Head of Mission to Karachi

MedTech & Digital Health Care Post-COVID-19: 2022-23 & Beyond

The SBC has prepared the following Market-Snapshot on MedTech & Digital Health Care sector to entice the Swiss Companies for collaboration with Pakistani Companies:

- With a population of over 220m, Pakistan is a fifth most populous country in the world - with an annual estimated population growth rate of 2.07%.
- The key factors driving Pakistan's growing demand for healthcare solutions & medical technologies are:
- 1. **Rapid population growth:** By 2030 there will be an estimated 263m people living in Pakistan.
- 2. An aging population: By 2030 people >65 years age may make up to 9.3% of Pakistan's population and being limited resourced country, it may pose a great challenge to deal with this medically and socially vulnerable population.

Ranked sixth amongst high-disease burden countries, Pakistan is currently facing double the burden of infectious and lifestyle diseases.

- As per World Health Organization's non-communicable diseases (NCDs) country profile it is estimated that NCDs are projected to account for 58% of all deaths in Pakistan
- The Aga Khan Development Network e-Health Resource Centre, provides strategic digital health support. -Commission on Science and Technology for Sustainable Development started a 1st of its kind healthcare delivery mechanism.
- In response to changing demographic & demand driven trends, Pakistan is re-modeling its healthcare system by inte- grating new technologies.
- Pakistan's annual healthcare expenditure has increased by 38% over the past decade and is forecasted to grow continu- ously.
- The Ministry of Information Technology & Telecommunication (MITT) has developed a HealthTech for application of organ- ized knowledge and skills in the



form of devices, medicines, vaccines, procedures & systems to solve health problems and improve quality of lives.

Leverage access to qualified specialists by building an online network of doctors and paramedical staff working directly or remotely with them. Promote digitization and automation of existing hospitals to develop a network across the country to facilitate nationwide integration of health related records and data through a central health database/s.

Opportunities in 2023 and beyond

 Establishment of Digital health platforms in different cities of Pakistan like MARHAM, Sehat Kahani, DoctHERS, NewLife, Oladoc and many others, enabling people to shift their medical consultations & purchases to online platforms.

- Energy demand in Pakistan has created highly profitable opportunities for Swiss companies to offer their solution and technology in renewable, hydel and clean technology power generation projects. After the development of Iran-Pakistan gas pipeline, & Saudi Arabia's decision to double the oil facilities for Pakistan, energy sector in Pakistan offers lucrative opportunities to Swiss Companies.
- Industrial growth has sparked massive demand in all facets of Pakistan's air, sea, rail, road and physical infrastructure. Apart from this, there is an immense potential in development of tourism infrastructure.
- Pakistan Railway was once the only enterprise providing rail service in the country, now Pakistan has comfortable luxury buses, covering the distance across the country. The road network has been expanding constantly. New motorways and expressways made throughout the country have significantly reduced the time it takes for goods and people to reach their destinations, which is also attracting international firms to set up their manufacturing plants for luxury buses. New initiatives like the establishment of Gwadar Port the construction and upgradation of new airports around the country and further expansion of the highway network have great potential for Swiss companies.
- Pakistan is building a train line which will connect Gawadar with rest of the country. An Oman based company Anvwar Asian Investments, expressed a keen interest in developing a 1,087 km railway line worth \$2.3 billion between Gawadar and Jacobabad, which will help Swiss companies who'll work in Gawadar to connect their routes with the rest of the country.

- To gauge Fintechs, the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) aims to establish a Fintech Facilitation Desk, where all interested Fintechs will be invited to gauge the Central Bank and establish a mutual understanding of how Digital Financial Services access can be extended.
- Over 25,000 IT graduates each year join a workforce of 500,000+ IT & IT Enabled Services professionals, 300,000 active freelancers, desirability for Pakistan's talent pool is among the highest in the world. And with benefits including income tax credit on IT & ITeS exports, zero Income tax on registered technology start-ups, tax holiday for venture capital funds, 100% repatriation of dividends and investments, and commercial loans at preferential rates, steps to unlock ease of business in Pakistan are in full swing.
- At present, only few FinTech operate in the country, and those are primarily in the developed cities of Lahore, Karachi & Islamabad. However, Pakistan possesses the potential to be an attractive market for FinTechs growth, owing to the increasing youth population, disruptive internet and smartphone penetration, consumer's preference for mobile phones and social media, a booming e-commerce market facilitating digital payments and an overall financial system having the absorption capacity for innovation.

The country is also witness to the ascending usage of online banking and digital payments supporting the locked down businesses that took off with the online orders on channels like Facebook, Amazon, Daraz, FoodPanda etc. With almost 73% of Pakistan's population having accessibility to cellular usage, making the country a fertile ground for FinTech growth. - Raast is Pakistan's first instant payment system that will enable end-to-end digital payments among individuals, businesses and government entities instantaneously. - Special Technology Zone Authority (STZA) provides legislative and institutional support for the development of Pakistan's technology sector. Through an ecosystem approach, we offer world-class physical & digital infrastructure and regulatory framework that can catapult Pakistan into a technology-driven future.

Archroma Pakistan shouldered their responsility in the time of acute crisis when devastating floods hit Sindh in August 2022.





The program supports public health objectives and empowers schools to improve nutrition knowledge and promote healthy habits among children through teaching the importance of balancing good nutrition and healthy hydration with an active lifestyle. Nestlé for Healthier Kids is a curriculum-based program, comprising of a book designed by Oxford University Press (in both English and Urdu), which provides basic knowledge on nutrition and encourages physical activity and the

intake of a balanced diet.

To date, the program in Pakistan has educated more than 285,000 children in rural, suburban and urban areas, and has trained over 1,500 teachers on nutrition in 340 schools.

Sustainability

In December 2020 Nestlé announced its intention to halve absolute emissions by 2030 and bring them to net zero by 2050. To achieve this, we will need to address emissions throughout our value chain and implement regenerative agriculture and nature-based solutions such as agroforestry and land restoration.

To ensure that we have a clear roadmap to achieve the goal we have set ourselves, all Nestlé markets, including Nestlé Pakistan, have finalized a 2025 Roadmap that will help us transform the way we operate, helping us to inspire change and deliver impact.

Nestlé Pakistan

Nestlé BISP Rural Women Sales Program: Empowering the rural women of Pakistan

Nestlé Pakistan in partnership with Benazir Income Support Program (BISP), as part of the Ehsaas Program, launched the Nestlé BISP Rural Women Sales Program in 2017 to provide livelihood opportunities to BISP beneficiaries.

The main premise of Nestlé BISP Rural Women Sales Program was to work for the upliftment of the rural women of Pakistan and put them on the path to prosperity. To date, this program has enrolled over 2200 BISP beneficiaries as Sales Agents. Nestlé Pakistan has also partnered with Akhuwat Pakistan (the largest interest-free microfinance program) whereby, improving access to finance, micro-loans worth PKR 2 million have been disbursed as part of this program to many women looking to scale their business.

This program has shown that economic upliftment can lead to wider social empowerment. Traditionally, women of rural Pakistan have been unable to participate in any structured economic activity. This intervention has helped these women get into the business of retail hence paving the way for economic empowerment. Furthermore, this project is allowing for greater financial inclusion, by improving financial access for these 'poorest of the poor' women.

Climate Change

Import of High-yield Cows

In Pakistan, a lot of the farmers get their milk supply from local cows, which are not efficient; the amount of resources and money that goes into feeding and maintaining them is disproportionately high when we compare it to the output the farmers get from them. That is why we decided to help the

farmers replace inefficient cows with efficient ones.

Biogas and Solar Units

Nestlé Pakistan contributed to the installation of solar energy systems at 10 dairy farms to encourage farmers to switch to renewable energy. We also helped with the installation of 10 biogas digesters, which will reduce greenhouse gas emissions resulting from cow dung.

Sustainable Packaging

In 2018, we announced our commitment to make 100% of our packaging recyclable or reusable by 2025. In January 2019, we



set out our broader vision for a waste-free future and announced a series of specific actions to meet our commitment.

Designed for Recycling Packaging

We are eliminating unnecessary packaging and phasing out materials that are not recyclable or are hard to recycle. We are investing more in the development of mono-material packaging, as well as alternative materials. As of 2021, 88% of Nestlé Pakistan's packaging is designed for recycling.

Shifting to Paper

In order to improve the environmental performance of our packaging, we introduced paper straws across our entire ready-to-drink product range. This makes Nestlé Pakistan the first food and beverage company in Pakistan to do so. The initiative has eliminated over 400 million plastic straws in 2021 alone, marking a breakthrough in our sustainable packaging transformation journey.

Waste-Free Future

Working towards our vision of a waste-free future, we have partnered with external organizations for projects that increase the volume of packaging waste that is collected and recycled. Another important aspect of our projects is to drive new behavior by creating awareness amongst society about everyone's role in helping tackle plastic waste – from industry to the consumers, from packaging manufacturers to the government.

Clean Gilgit and Hunza Project

Gilgit and Hunza, located on Karakoram Highway, are two famous tourist destinations in Gilgit-Baltistan region. With a combined population of approximately 400,000 plus, Gilgit and Hunza have become a popular attraction for local and foreign tourists with more than 1 million tourists visiting the area annually.

In line with our global vision of a waste-free future, Nestlé Pakistan partnered with the respective District Councils and Gilgit Baltistan Waste Management company (GBWMC), to launch the Clean Gilgit and Hunza Project. The initiative is being supported by our leading brands; NESTLÉ FRUITA VITALS and NESTLÉ PURE LIFE.

Clean Gilgit and Hunza Project focuses on waste segregation and recycling systems for Gilgit and Hunza. We have installed two bailing machines, one in Hunza and the other in Gilgit, that have encouraged waste management of around 200,000 kgs of plastic and paper packaging waste in 2021, eventually leading up to 1000 tons by 2025 to make the region wastefree and promote sustainable tourism in the region. The project, which is the first of its kind at such high-altitude tourist locations, shall make a positive environmental impact at both local and national level.





Caring for Water

The Caring for Water-Pakistan (C4W-Pakistan) is a blueprint for gauging collective action and bringing different partners together to discuss and find solutions for the existing water challenges faced by Pakistan. Launched in 2017, our water stewardship efforts under C4W-Pakistan were reinforced in 2021 with the launch of the Water Pledge, where we committed to regenerating the water used by our Waters Business and have a net positive impact by 2025.



Nestlé Pakistan

We have undertaken several activities under three overarching pillars of the C4W-Paksitan initiative: **Factories**, **Communities**, and **Agriculture**.

In our 'Factories', we have continuously improved water efficiency by reducing withdrawals and reusing water, wherever possible. Doing so has enabled us to reduce per ton consumption of product by **14.05%** in 2021 compared to 2015. We are also the first market within Nestlé to have all our sites certified for the Alliance for Water Stewardship (AWS) Standard. In the 'Communities' we have a presence in, we have established **6** Safe and Clean Drinking Water Facilities. These facilities provide free access to clean and safe drinking water to **60,000** people every day.

However, more than **90%** of Pakistan's water resources are used in **'Agriculture'** and **50%** of that water is wasted. To meet our Pledge, we needed to address water wastage in agriculture. In this regard, with the help of our Waters Business, we helped farmers embrace technological solutions to reduce water wastage across 653 acres in 2021 with plans of scaling up. We have helped farmers install drip irrigation in partnership with the Agriculture Department, Government of Punjab and the World Bank, and smart soil moisture sensors that measure sub-surface moisture, developed in partnership with the Center for Water Informatics and Technology (WIT), LUMS. We are also working with Pakistan Agriculture and Research Council (PARC) and University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences (UVAS) by showcasing High-Efficiency Irrigation System (HEIS). This site showcases best farm practices.



Our internal evaluations suggest that by the end of 2021, we have been able to help regenerate equivalent to 49% of the water volume used by our Waters Business. With continued effort, we will take it to 100% regeneration and then a net positive impact by 2025.

Humanitarian Assistance

At Nestlé, we care deeply for people and for the communities in which we operate, and we believe we have an essential role to play during challenging times. Recently, Pakistan has been devastated by severe floods, affecting 80 districts in all the provinces affecting more than 33 million people.

Nestlé Pakistan extended in kind support of 325,000 liters of water and 10,000 liters of milk to National Disaster Management Authority for distribution among the flood affectees.

We have also donated PKR 22 million rupees worth product (more than 700,000 servings of Nestlé BUNYAD) to meet the nutritional needs of affectees in its response to the flood relief efforts in Sindh.

Nestlé Pakistan has also invited all its employees to step forward and contribute for supporting people going through hard times; these donations have been matched 1:1 by the company. These funds will be used to support rehabilitation efforts for flood affectees. Nestlé Headquarter in Switzerland has also extended a corporate donation that will be used in collaboration with government to increase access to nutrition for children in affected communities through our nutritious products.





SICPA Pakistan has transitioned from the conventional CSR to align its social and environmental projects in line with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs). Some of the projects undertaken were :

Efforts to maintain Good Health and Well-being in line with UN SDGs # 3 Good Health & Well-Being and #6 Clean Water & Sanitation:

SICPA Pakistan collaborated with Hisaar Foundation to install a solar bore system and two hand pumps in three villages in Tharparkar. This investment has resulted in providing access to clean water to an estimated population of 1000 persons and their 600 livestock. These projects would also benefit residents from adjoining villages.

SICPA Pakistan supported Fatimid Foundation by bearing the medical expenses of a Thalassemia (major) girl patient aged 2 years.

Partnering with Fatimid Foundation, a blood donation camp was organized for employees, whereby 54 employees donated blood. As SICPA Pakistan is registered with Fatimid Foundation, employees and their families are facilitated in emergency cases of blood requirement.

SICPA Pakistan has also supported The Kidney Center and Layton Rahmatullah Benevolent Trust (LRBT).

Efforts to secure the Environment in line with UN SDG # 12 Responsible Consumption & Production and #13 Climate Action

SICPA Pakistan's strategy is to work on both energy efficiency as well transfer of our energy needs to renewable energy.

We started the transition to renewable energy with a 200 KW solar system in 2020, resulting in reduction of carbon foot-

prints by 180 tons of CO2 in a year. With the success of the first phase, an additional 157 KW were added in 2021 to bring annual carbon reduction to 326 tons of CO2 annually.

Currently, around 45% of our energy needs are being fulfilled by solar energy. We intend to further add 250 KW solar energy to our system by 2024 to shift completely to solar energy as a primary source of energy.

We have established a comprehensive system to manage environmental risks and ensure our operations comply with environmental good practices.

Efforts to improve lives in line with UN SDGs # 4 Quality Education, #8 Decent Work & Economic Growth





Syngenta Pakistan contributes to country's exports through Exportable Rice Initiative

As the world population continues to grow, the production of food is gaining prime importance especially in the context of food security challenges. Furthermore, agricultural products play an important role in a country's economy.

In Pakistan, rice is one of the main agricultural exportable commodities of the country which has contributed over \$ 2.5 Billion to the country's exports during FY 2021-22 alone.

However, meeting import tolerance limits of main export markets such as EU and USA has been a challenge for our rice farmers and exporters. At the same time, the produce of the local farmers is being negatively impacted by climate-change, lack of technology and injudicious use of pesticides, while post-harvest losses are also reducing the growers' livelihood.

To proactively deal with these challenges of farmers and rice exporters, Syngenta Pakistan the market-leader in agricultural technology

and innovation, has launched a resourceful initiative since 2020, to enrich the rice production in the country. As part of this initiative, Syngenta Pakistan is collaborating with the rice value chain partners to produce exportable rice that fulfills maximum residue limits (MRLs) and export regulations of the biggest markets including Europe and USA.


