

The SBC entered into a service performance agreement with S-GE in 2014 and immediately after entering into the agreement, SBC provided partner-search services to S-GE for Swiss companies in the sectors of food processing technology, plastic and laser welding, fire protection glass and common rail system - including the recent FFM of Jamailah Switzerland AG to Pakistan to find a trading partner for distribution of their consumer goods in Pakistan. Noteworthy, couple of them are successfully launched and represented in Pakistan. One of the Swiss company also participated in exhibitions in Karachi and Lahore together with its partner - M/s. Dynamic Solutions (Member of SBC) this year and last year. The results were very positive in terms of lead generation and resulting sales.

The SBC in collaboration with S-GE is planning another FFM for glass reinforced plastic piping systems to Pakistan followed by the participation of Swiss universities' in Education Expo in Pakistan.







#### **Fact-Finding Mission of Ganser CRS to Pakistan**

The SBC in partnership with S-GE and in collaboration with the Patron-in-Chief and Patron of SBC organized the FFM of Ganser CRS to Pakistan

#### **Brief Introduction of Ganser CRS**

• Ganser CRS (GCRS) has successfully equipped locomotives and construction machinery for decades. In 2006, the family enterprise – founded 30 years ago – targeted an ambitious export project. The company's aim was to supply the Indian Railways with the most modern, electronically controlled common-rail injection systems for their existing and also new diesel engines. A highly ambitious undertaking given the fact that, after Russia, India

operates the largest state railway company in the world – with 1.5 million employees and thousands of locomotives. The latter had become quite outdated and had an enormous modernization potential.

• Until exports leaped, five (05) years passed during which preliminary work and the complex search for local partners took place as well as establishing the permanent contact to Indian

Railways. GCRS was supported by S-GE. With the assistance of the Pool of Experts and S-GE's local Swiss Business Hub in Mumbai contacts were established and negotiations conducted. In 2011, the joint venture agreement was signed with an Indian partner company, and at the end of 2013, the first (1st) locomotives equipped with the GCRS technology finally went into service.

- GCRS aim in three (03) years' time is to equip approximately 300 locomotive engines per year.
- GCRS develops, produces, sells and distributes Common Rail injection systems for efficient and powerful diesel and dual fuel engines.

- Common Rail injection systems from GCRS allow you to reduce fuel consumption of your diesel and dual fuel engines.
- Common Rail injection brings remarkable improvements to diesel and dual fuel engines. It is the current and future injection technology for diesel and dual fuel engines worldwide.
- Common Rail injection is a significant technological upgrade for any diesel or dual fuel engine. It represents an essential step in the modernization process of every diesel and dual fuel engine.
- Fuel consumption is being reduced by 5-15% compared to an existing engine with conventional injection. This results in substantial operational cost savings.



- From Greece, Morocco, Italy and Tunisia.

#### A lot of lowest level quality oil in the market: Pomace oil

Olive pomace oil is olive oil that is extracted from olive pulp after the first press. Once the mechanical oil extraction of olive oil is complete, approximately 5-8% of the oil remains in the pulp, which then needs to be extracted with the help of chemical solvents, an industrial technique used in the production of most other edible oils including canola, peanut, sunflower, etc. Although the oil extracted in this manner is still olive oil, at retail it may not simply be called "olive oil".

Warnings about possible carcinogenic properties of olive-pomace oil have been issued by the British Food Standards Agency as well as others.

Quoted from the above reference, "Olive-Pomace oil is made from the residue left after producing virgin olive oil. It is the lowest grade of oil and it represents only a tiny amount of the UK vegetable oil market, around 0.25% of the one million tons consumed each year.

The high contamination PAH's\*1 is believed to result from the process used to produce this oil. The Spanish government introduced a temporary ban on olive-pomace oil in response to these findings.

It has now set legal limits for the maximum amount of PAHs in olive oil."

\*1) Polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), some of which can cause cancer, were found in some olive-pomace oil products.







## SMALL PROJECTS SUPPORTED BY THE EMBASSY:

The Embassy of Switzerland has a small projects' fund that has, over the years, been catering to projects in the development as well as the human rights' fields. With the basic aim to provide support to the NGOs that do not otherwise have access to normal sources of finance, the small projects have been focused on diverse areas, such as, education, health, women's rights, due process of law, skills' development and youth.

### EMPOWERING THE KALASHA COMMUNITIES THROUGH SAFEGUARDING THEIR INTANGIBLE CULTURAL HERITAGE (ICH)

The Embassy of Switzerland collaborated with a local partner and UNESCO for a project aimed at enhancing the capacity of the Kalash communities of Rumbur and Birir valleys in documenting, mapping and safeguarding their intangible cultural heritage. In this ongoing project, the provincial and federal governments are set to be taken on board and contacts will be developed with the community members and their elders. The Kalash youth and the



concerned governmental staff will be engaged for capacity building on the UNESCO Convention 2003 and Community Based Inventorying (CBI). The CBI process will help local communities in Birir and Rumbur to identify elements of their culture that need



urgent safeguarding. Recommendations will be forwarded to the government for its consideration to send it to the UNESCO Convention 2003 Secretariat. The information gathered through the project shall inform the preparation of safeguarding plans of ICH, future proposals for livelihood and income generation of local community of Kalash and preparation of international requests to the Secretariat of the UNESCO 2003 Convention for its possible future financial assistance to Kalash.

#### **CHILD MARRIAGE AWARENESS WORKSHOPS**

The Embassy partnered with the Aizan Development Foundation for a project aimed at sensitizing different segments of the society about child marriages. In this project, nine child marriage awareness workshops are being conducted across the province of Punjab. The aim is to reach out to the relevant, vulnerable individuals and educate them about the disadvantages of getting their children involved in an early marriage. The workshops are providing a flow of information on the legal and ethical boundaries of early marriages by presenting the audience with case studies. The project is set to select at least 100 people (including policemen, marriage registrars, clerics, religious leaders, community heads and parents of out-of-school children) from each of the nine selected districts to attend and participate in the training / awareness raising workshops. Resultantly, at the end of the project,





900 people will be sensitized in all. In order to ensure sustainability of the project, at least 10 Task Force Members will be identified from each district to monitor the situation on early child marriage within their community.

#### COMPASSIONATE FOOTPRINT

Recognizing the importance of peace education, the Embassy entered into collaboration with the Charter for Compassion Pakistan for a project titled 'Compassionate Footprint'. Fifteen schools were selected each from the rural and urban areas of the Karachi city. Following four separate - but interlinked - activities, the project introduced the students to "Peace Education" to help them understand the significance of a peaceful environment through discussion. Other activities revolved around promoting healthy debates on peace building among the students by encouraging them to discuss and debate upon issues, such as: quality education for all, the security environment, medical facilities, clean food and water and the respect of laws. Then again, the schools (privileged and underprivileged) were partnered to plant tree samplings in each other's schools and the students were asked to monitor the growth of their partner's tree to not only protect the environment but also promote peace and co-existence.

#### CREATIVE CULTURE AND EDUCATION ART WORKSHOP

Highland Art Recreational Aesthetic Enhancement Program Pakistan (HAREEP) is a non-profit organization working to promote art and creative education for the development of moderate and underprivileged civil societies by channelizing talents of potential artists and craftspeople hailing from rural areas. Its collaboration with the Embassy of Switzerland led to the initiation of the 'Creative Culture and Education Art Workshop' project focusing to stimulate the innate, untapped skills of the children residing in underprivileged areas of Faisalabad, Punjab. The project aimed at opening new vistas of opportunities for the educators, to encourage positive energies amongst the rural areas' children and to provide new methods of teaching and learning both to the educators and the children. It not only inculcated confidence amongst the participating children but, hinging on art therapeutic based activities, also instilled character development, observational skills and collaboration in them. The data collected in this project is also being used for a research to be sent to the local government and donors to highlight the importance of art education in learning.

During Regula Bubb's visit to Pakistan, the Ambassador of Switzerland, Mr. Marc P. George hosted a reception to launch her book in Islamabad at his residence on October 20, 2016. Around 150 guests attended the reception.

The book is a narrative of an intriguing society of contrasts, exploring a fascinating blend of political realities and societal conforms that makes Pakistan a very compelling country.

#### **SCULPTURE EXHIBITION:**





The exhibition provided an opportunity to unleash the aesthetic potential of young and promising Pakistani sculptors.

### SCREENING OF SPANISH FILM CO-DIRECTED BY A SWISS-COLOMBIAN FILM MAKER:

A series of events under the theme "Human Rights through Cinematography" kicked off with the screening of Spanish film "Sabogal" co-directed and written a by Swiss-Colombian film maker, Juan Jose Lozano, at the Swiss Ambassador's residence on December 5, 2015. The Swiss Embassy and the United Nations Information Centre (UNIC) hosted the screening. Based on facts and designed by a 140-persons team in various countries, the film paints the picture of a corrupt and rotten country, while depicting a character in constant danger and yet obsessively committed in his fight for justice.

While explaining the theme of the film, the Ambassador of Switzerland, Mr. Marc P George said the idea is to create human rights awareness through films and cinematography. He also thanked the European Union, the UN and the International Film



Festival and Forum of Human Rights, Geneva, for making the series possible.

#### **CELEBRATIONS OF FRANCOPHONIE:**

The documentary illustrates the risks of extinction of the Kalash culture. #### Screening of a documentary on Human Rights:

In line with the tradition and with an objective to promote human rights, the Ambassador of Switzerland, Mr. Marc P. George, hosted the Human Rights Documentary Screening entitled "Sahar Batool Insaf Maangti Hai, Justice demanded" in collaboration with the Nomad Gallery on April 20, 2016 at his residence. Over 60 guests from diplomatic community, international



organizations and local non-governmental organizations involved in promoting human rights attended the event.

Sahar Batool, a six-year-old girl from the Hazara community was raped and murdered in Quetta Cantonment in October 2014. The documentary not only focused on the victim and her family but also shed light on larger perspective of human rights violations from child abuse to misuse of blasphemy laws. Issues the short film tries to tackle, include Shia genocide, target killings of marginalized communities such as Christians and Hazaras and the plight of internally displaced women from Fata. It also highlights importance of empowering women and youth.

The Embassy of Switzerland in Pakistan celebrated the 725th Swiss

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





Speaking at the occasion, Mujtaba Rahim, CEO, Archroma Pakistan Limited, said:



The estimate rises to over 50% in poorest countries of Asia and Africa, where tuberculosis, malaria and diarrhea may be the leading cause of death. Yet most of these diseases can be prevented or treated. Novartis believes that medicines alone cannot solve the underlying problems of poverty, inadequate public health services or lack of healthcare personnel and infrastructure that beset developing countries like Pakistan. We do however recognize that access to our medicines today may be restricted on account of affordability especially amongst people not covered under adequate socio-economic nets. It is for this very reason Novartis continues to strive and forge partnerships with other stakeholders in finding and implementing solutions to help close the access gap. Novartis in Pakistan is working in a number of successful public/private partnerships with a view to extend the access of its modern and quality medicines to wider patient groups in Pakistan.

Beginning in 2003, Novartis started aninnovative patient access program (GIPAP) in Pakistan for patients suffering from Chronic Myeloid Leukemia (CML)from all walks of life. Through this program hundreds of patients gained access to treatment at 3 centers in Pakistanfor a disease which earlier on presented a very bleak prognosis due to lack of access. However, to increase access in a manner that facili-

cities, Novartis Oncology Access Program was initiated in 2009. To date this program has been extended to cover Chronic Myeloid Leukemia (CML), Gastrointestinal Stromal Tumors (GIST), Advanced Breast Cancer, Metastatic Renal Cell Carcinoma (mRCC), Pancreatic Neuroendocrine Tumors (PNET), Polycythemia Vera (PV) and myelofibrosis (MF).

Novartis along with increasing access also gives equal importance to sustainability of providing long-term access to all patients especially those under the poverty line. Therefore, Novartis Oncology sought alliances with several Provincial Governments to realize the collective objective of helping all poor cancer patients of the country irrespective of gender, caste and creed to create sustainable projects to help patients in the long-term.

Currently thereare4 projectsrunningin Baluchistan, Punjab, KPK and Sindh incollaboration with respective governments providing free access to Glive cand Tasignatomore than 5000 CML and GIST patients. Since inception, the value contribution of free goods provided in these projects is PKR 18.3 Billion. Besides assisting patients through the seprograms, Novartis Oncologyals opartnered with Government and local societies, both medical as well as patient groups, in disseminating knowledge through organizing CMEs, commemorating important thal assemia and cancer related international events and PR activities.

Over the last 12 years, Novartis has consciously invested over Rupees 45 billion to assist innumerable patients requiring advanced and expensive treatments for survival.

In recognition of these efforts, Novartis was presented with an Outstanding Achievement Award by the President of Pakistan. The President noted that Novartis has contributed free medication of


the highest value to poor cancer patients through its one-of-akind access program, unique among all of the pharmaceutical companies in the country.



June 1st marks the official inauguration of the world's longest tunnel. Sika's front-line technologies and construction expertise played a crucial role in the successful completion of the one of Europe's most important infrastructure projects. The immensely challenging quality requirements were met through the use of Sika's durable solutions for waterproofing, fire protection, coatings, and concrete and shortcrete production. As the world's longest rail tunnel, the 57 km-long structure is both a novelty and a tour-de-force in tunnel engineering which forms the centerpiece of the new transalpine rail route (NEAT).

It embodies the Swiss values of innovation, precision and reliability. These values-upheld at all levels with pride, satisfaction and in a true spirit of partnership by Sika's project team on a daily basis throughout the 14-year construction period and, even before that, during the preliminary phase from 1996-have helped to cement the success of this once-in-a-lifetime project. The Gotthard base tunnel is an impressive demonstration of how Sika builds with and for people. The new Gotthard tunnel project required Sika to draw on the full breadth of its construction expertise.

Waterproofing systems, construction chemicals know-how and machinery solutions were only part of the package. High-grade shotcrete was used to support the tunnel excavation. This served as the base for the Sikaplan and Sarnafil waterproofing membranes. The concrete lining was then placed using Sika admixtures so as to achieve the high degree of precision required for the tunnel surface geometry. The flawless concrete finish is a visible testament to the outstanding concreting workmanship.









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
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
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
