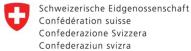

Technical Demonstration Event of Katadyn Group Switzerland

Mr. Johann Wille, General Manager Asia and Mr. Yong Zheng, Head of Operations of the Katadyn Group joined from the regional office of the Katadyn Group in Singapore to perform a live demonstration of their products, "Aquifer 4000" and the "Rapidyn Water Filter" to be introduced in Pakistan.

"Aquifer 4000" is the world's only mobile desalination system capable of producing up to 20,000 liters of fresh water daily and has been deployed in various crisis situations, including Gaza. The "Rapidyn Water Filter", featuring a Swiss-made ceramic candle with unmatched flow rate and lifespan, ensures sustainability for every Household Water Treatment System (HWTS) project. It has also been selected by UNICEF's supply division as their household filtration solution of choice.

FOCUS 2025 – 2027

Over the years, the Swiss Business Council (SBC) continued to actively strengthen its presence and expand its role in serving the Swiss and Pakistani business communities across borders. The Council placed a strong emphasis on advancing trade and investment promotion initiatives, while fostering new partnerships and deepening existing collaborations.

The President and Executive Committee Members of SBC devoted special attention to creating new opportunities for Swiss companies to explore the Pakistani market, as well as supporting Pakistani stakeholders in building sustainable business linkages with Switzerland. Guided by its mission, SBC remained committed to promoting best practices, facilitating dialogue, and working towards a level playing field that encourages innovation, investment, and mutual growth between the two countries.

Swiss Foot Prints in Pakistan

As of 2025, Switzerland continues to rank among the top foreign investors in Pakistan, with around 27 Swiss multinationals operating across pharmaceuticals, food & beverages, agriculture, textiles, chemicals, energy, and banking. Together, these companies run 19 manufacturing units, employ nearly 15,000 people, and have contributed over USD 200 million in net FDI during FY 2024-25, further building on the CHF 1.5 billion invested over the past decade. 203.3 Million USD.



Several Swiss companies have long contributed to Pakistan's development, and that role is growing. Today, about 27 Swiss multinational companies are actively operating in sectors such as healthcare, banking, agriculture, food & beverages, textiles, chemicals, energy, infrastructure and services in Pakistan. These firms provide employment to nearly 15,000 people (directly), and maintain manufacturing units, headquarters, and R&D or operations in key cities like Karachi, Lahore, and Islamabad. This expanding participation reflects not just investment and technology transfer, but a deepening of Swiss-Pakistani economic ties, where Swiss expertise is helping to build capacity, improve standards, and nurture local skills in diverse industries.

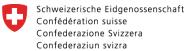
Growth of Swiss Companies in Pakistan

Nestlé Pakistan reported its full year results for 2024, with sales at PKR 193.2 billion, reflecting a decline of 3.7% compared to the previous year.

The results were announced at the end of the Company's Board of Directors' meeting at its Head Office in Lahore.

Sale performance was primarily impacted by the implementation of 18% General Sales Tax (GST) through Finance Act 2024, across majority of our portfo-

lio, which was passed on to consumers leading to a reduced demand. The Company continued to invest strongly behind the brands, which, vestie topline,

Jed toadecline in operating profit. In 2024, our focus on empowering our people, fostering inclusivity and creating a workplace where everyone thrives as we strengthened our efforts on financial literacy, talent devel-

opment, employee en-

gagement, well-being,

and diversity. The per-

centage of female leaders grew to 27.5% this year from 23.4% last year.

The Company continues to be a force for good, investing PKR 4.4 billion in the country in 2024, with PKR 875 million spent on renewable energy (solar and biomass)

All of our sustainability targets for 2024 were met including greenhouse gas reduction, sustainable packaging, water regeneration, collection of plastic waste, together with the inauguration of our 9th clean, safe drinking water facility.

Pakistan not only enhanced operational excellence but also made a meaningful contribution to the health, well-being, and livelihoods of the communities it serves. These results demonstrate the company's enduring role as a leader in responsible business practices and its ongoing contribution to Pakistan's sustainable development.

Development of the Sub Committees

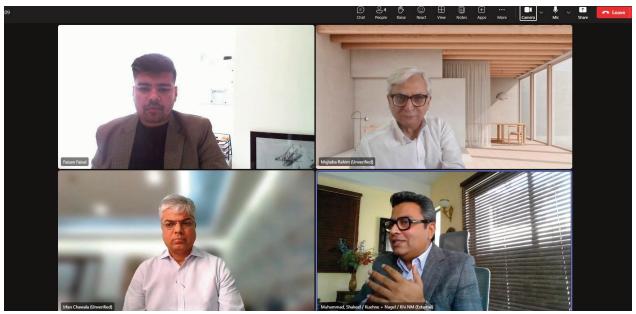

Introduction to Intellectual Property Rights

Intellectual Property (IP) is an all-encompassing term for intangible property, which is a product of human intellect.

It is divided into two categories:

1. Industrial Property - includes patents for inventions, trademarks, industrial designs,

and geographical indications.

2. Copyrights – covers literary, dramatic, musical, and artistic works (such as novels,

poems, plays, drawings, paintings, photographs, sculptures) and architectural designs.

An owner or creator of the aforesaid intellectual property is afforded Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) by virtue of their creations, which does not differ from any other property rights and confers the status of property on the above-mentioned intangible items.

IPR refers to exclusive rights that either a person or a company has acquired to use their ideas, concepts, and intangible property for a specified period of time. The laws relating to Intellectual Property provide certain exclusive rights to the inventors or creators of that property, enabling them to reap commercial benefits from their creative efforts or reputation and to prevent others from using their property without prior permission in an unlawful manner.

In simple terms, Intellectual Property can be referred to as the creation of the mind. Such a creation can include:

- Conceiving a unique and distinctive name for a brand or business (Trademark)
- An invention related or unrelated to technology (Patent)
- Works related to arts (Copyright)
- Devising a unique ornamental and/or aesthetic aspect of an article (Industrial Designs)
- Protecting confidential and/or proprietary information from disclosure (Trade Secrets)

Growth and Importance of IPR

IPR has increasingly been recognized as important for nations to grow and emerge as knowledge-based economies. It acts as a catalyst for nations to enhance innovation and competitiveness.

The use of formal IPR mechanisms by firms has increased in importance globally during the past 40 years due to the rise of the knowledge economy and the increasing importance of intangible assets in new economic sectors such as technology and R&D.

Key benefits of IP protection include:

- Providing incentives and recognition to creators of new ideas and innovations
- Protecting the commercial and legal interests of creators
- Ensuring material reward by adding immense commercial value
- Making genuine and original products available

The ways in which IPR encourages innovation and drives economic growth in certain sectors are detailed below:

IPR, Businesses and Branding

The protection of intellectual property has become a leading concern in the corporate world.

- Heavy expenditure in research, development, marketing, production, and management requires large firms to ensure their IP is protected, not only from piracy but also from those attempting to take a "free ride" on their repu-
- A company's IP portfolio is often its largest asset, sometimes accounting for as much as 70% of its corporate
- By expanding patent portfolios or establishing registered trademarks, corporations can secure their market position and lead in the fight against infringement.
- Brands form an integral part of intellectual property assets. Without proper protection, companies are more vulnerable to competition, less attractive to investors, and unable to act against imitators.

Example: Google acquired Motorola for \$12.5 billion and later sold it to Lenovo for \$2.91 billion, excluding Motorola's valuable IP in smartphone technology. The price difference directly reflects the value of retained IP assets.

Thus, IP rights help businesses protect market shares, maximize revenue streams, and commercialize innovations through licensing, sales, or direct use.

IPR and Public Health

Innovation, discovery of new treatments, and development of medicines are essential for society, and IPR plays a central role.

- Intellectual Property sustains financing models for pharmaceutical R&D.
- By protecting inventions, pharmaceutical companies can recover investments and continue research.
- Without IP protection, private funding for drug research would diminish, undermining healthcare innovation.



Pakistan's Take on Intellectual Property

In line with global recognition of Intellectual Property, Pakistan has been consistently modernizing its laws and enacting new ones according to internationally accepted standards

IP in Pakistan includes (but is not limited to):

- Copyrights
- **Patents**
- **Trademarks**
- **Industrial Designs**

Each aspect of IP is governed by its own laws, protecting brands, inventions, designs, and creative works from unauthorized use or exploitation.

In addition to domestic laws, Pakistan is a signatory to various international treaties, which aim to harmonize IP policies among member countries. These treaties ensure consistency in basic principles and provide cross-border enforceability.

Prior to such treaties, protecting and enforcing IP rights across multiple countries was difficultdue to differences in national laws.
